Sale Showground Rules and Equine Etiquette

Sale and District Agricultural Society, as owner and manager of Sale Showground, Sale-Maffra Rd., Sale, considers the well-being of all persons visiting and/or using Sale Showgrounds to be of the utmost importance.

The Society's Equine Etiquette guide is designed to enable you to contribute to the Society commitment toward ensuring personal safety through risk management initiatives aimed at, wherever practical, eliminating or reducing adverse behaviour, practices or procedures.

Failure by persons within Sale Showground to endeavour to comply with the Society's Equine Etiquette will be considered a breach of Showground rules and sufficient grounds to be asked to vacate the Showground.

Entering Showground and Parking:

Drive in slowly! When parking, leave room around the nearest float where horses may be tied.

Moving on the Showground:

Our Showground rule is always move at a walk outside the arena.

Arena Entry:

Don't block the arena gate area.

Arena Etiquette:

Keep within the designated warm-up area. Exit arena immediately if asked to do so.

Yards:

Yards: A limited number of permanent yards are available within the Showgrounds for Showground events. An overnight yarding fee must be paid. This fee - plus camping fee - also applies to travellers using yards for overnighting.

Tying up:

Horses must not be tied to any Showground fencing whether of permanent or temporary construction. Tie only to your float.

Dogs:

If you must bring a dog to our show, our rule is that dogs must be constrained on a lead at all time but also be prepared to have to lock your dog in your float. Never tie a dog to the outside of a vehicle or float.

Camping fees:

All persons camping overnight anywhere within Sale Showgrounds must register on arrival with the resident Showground Managers (at cottage at far eastern end of Showground) and pay the nightly fee. There are no exceptions.

Public Caravan Park:

Horse/float owners are prohibited from parking or camping within the designated Sale Showground Caravan Park precinct (the area east of the sealed roadway eastwards of the main arena) with exception only, and then only with Society permission, at significant events such as World Cup Showjumping.

Sewage Dump Point:

A black-water sewage dump point located on the north side of the main arena (clearly marked with blue/white Campervan and Motorhome Club of Australia sign) must be used for emptying portable toilets.

Society policies compliance:

All persons visiting or using Sale Showgrounds are required to comply with Sale and District Agricultural Society's policies, such policies including those relating to Risk Assessment, Emergency Reaction Procedures, Alcohol and Drugs, Bullying and Harassment, Incident Reporting etc
