### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF ENTRY

1. All goats must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor
2. All stud animals must be registered with the BGBAA at time of entry
3. Age of animals to be calculated to date of show
4. Animals to be in allocated pens by 9am
5. Animals will be inspected for foot conditions and external parasites upon arrival and an exhibitor will remove animal/s from the showground upon request by a steward or official of the show.
6. No animal will be admitted into the pavilion unless duly entered by the due date. This requires the completion of the entry form accompanied by payment in full, National Goat Health Statement (see attachment) and copies of BGBAA registration papers for stud entries.
7. All goats must have a minimum National John's Disease Risk Rating of two (refer explanatory notes National Goat Health Statement).
8. Identification of Stud animals will be according to BGBAA regulations, either tattoo or double tagged is accepted.
9. A separate pen area will be provided for accredited John's MN status entries
10. Details of entries/exhibitors will not be made available to the Judge prior to or in the course of judging.
11. Classes may be combined or split at the discretion of the chief steward
12. The judge reserves the right to transfer goat/s to another class if he/she feels their development or other factors is more appropriate for competition in another class.
13. All animals will be required to be correctly tagged for NLIS requirements.
14. Red Boer Stud animals will be judged together with the Standard Boers in the same class. If sufficient Red Boers are entered for a class, they will be judged separately. All winners of eligible classes, both Red Boers and Standard Boers, will be included in the appropriate age related Championships.
15. Commercial classes. Registered animals are not eligible for inclusion in commercial classes

16. Most successful exhibitor awards will be calculated on the basis of class awards, 3 points first in class, 2 points for second, 1 point third.

**ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE.** By arrangement with the Goat Show Co-coordinator, goats may arrive and be penned any time between 5pm and 11pm on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October. Notification not required for animals arriving between 6a.m. and 9.00 a.m. on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> October. All animals must be in their pens by 9 a.m. on the day of the show. Washing facilities are not available. Exhibitors arriving on evening of 28<sup>th</sup> are permitted to stay on the show ground, but limited facilities are available, and no caravans are permitted. Limited parking is available on the show ground.

**PENNING.** Straw will be provided.

**Departure** will be from 4pm if judging is completed by this time and at the direction of the Chief Steward.

**DRESS CODE.** All Stud exhibitors must wear white coats in the judging ring.

**ORDER OF JUDGING.** Judging will commence at 10am. Stud and Commercial animals will be judged in their own areas. During each class and when requested, Stud animals will be required to run free in an enclosed area. For this year, Commercial animals will be judged in their pens and will not be required to be released into a separate judging area.

**EXPLANATORY NOTES:**

**1. Risk Factors:**

- (a) The herd contains goats that were born or raised with dairy goats. The herd contains dairy breeds or dairy cross breed goats. Exceptions are goats that are from Goat MAP herds, or goats born and raised in WA.
- (b) The herd has grazed land in the past 5 years that is at risk of JD contamination. Land at risk of JD contamination includes land that is being grazed, or has been grazed in the preceding 12 months, by:
  - Dairy breeds or dairy cross bred goats, which are not sourced from GoatMAP herds.
  - Goat herds with RD2 or lower status.
  - Dairy cattle with a Dairy Assurance Score of less than 7.
  - Beef cattle, other than those in the CattleMAP or Beef Only.
  - Sheep which have an ABC score of less than 3.

**2. RD2:** A herd which has had a second negative herd test of all animals over 12 months of age in the herd, at least 2 years after RD1 status was achieved as part of an Approved Property Disease Management Plan.

**3. RD1:** A herd with a history of infection which has had 1 negative herd test of all animals over 12 months of age in the herd, at least 12 months after the last infected animal was removed from the herd as part of an approved Property Disease Management Plan.

**4. Infected but undertaking an approved Property Disease Management Plan:** An infected herd that has not yet progressed to RD1 status but is complying with an on-farm disease control program combining elements of testing, kid rearing and biosecurity that has been approved by Chief Veterinary Officer (CVO) of the jurisdiction.

**5. Infected: means infected with Johne's disease.** Herds are no longer regarded as infected when a Property Disease Management Plan, which has been approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer (CVO) of the jurisdiction, has been completed.

**6. Check Test:** A test of 50 goats over 12 months of age in the herd (or all goats over 12 months of age in smaller herds) by serology or faecal culture or pooled faecal culture of two (2) pools each of 25 goats, with negative results. The animals should be selected so as to increase the probability of detecting infection, i.e. older animals, animals in poor body condition.

**7. Approved Vaccinated Goat: A goat that is:**

- vaccinated with an approved Johne's disease vaccine by 16 weeks of age; or vaccinated with an approved Johne's disease vaccine after 16 weeks of age where, in the written opinion of a GoatMAP approved veterinarian, vaccination occurred prior to exposure to Johne's disease infection; and
- is identified by an Approved Vaccination Tag.

**8. Nationally approved kid rearing program:** A kid rearing program designed to minimise the spread of Johne's disease in intensively managed herds, which has been documented and agreed by GICA and Animal Health Committee. (In development)
