VAS LTD RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

250 g Sultanas
250 g Chopped Raisins
250 g Currant's
125 g Chopped mixed peel
90 g Chopped red glace cherries
90 g Chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250g Plain flour,
60g self raising flour
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g butter
250 g soft brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
1/2 teaspoon almond essence
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs

METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle
with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1hr., but
preferably overnight. Sift together the flour and spices. Cream
together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the
eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then
alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly.
The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden
spoon. Place the mixture into a 20cm prepared square tin
and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours.
Allow cake to cool in tin. NOTE: To ensure uniformity and
depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be
chopped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and
almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.
